




Warren Miller Gentry

He will be missed by all of those who loved him. Warren was preceded in death by his wife Billie who passed away on November 4, 2008. Warren is survived by his longtime friend Fern Porter, Sons Ed (Shannon), Tom (Debbie) and Brad, and grandchildren Jennifer and Jay (Hope).
